
# First Lutheran Church Confirmation Handbook



2018-19 School Year

## Why Confirmation?

When your child was baptized you made a promise to help them grow in the Christian faith and life by bringing them to worship, teaching them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the 10 Commandments, and nurturing them in faith and prayer. Now that they are older, your children will begin the process of affirming the baptismal vows made for them by learning more about their faith. Throughout the three years of confirmation your child will learn more about the Old and New Testament as well as receive instruction from Luther's Catechism. Confirmation is your child's affirmation of their baptismal vows.

## What is the parent's role in confirmation?

As a parent, you play an important role in your child's faith formation. You should attend worship on a regular basis **with** your child, bring them to confirmation class each week, encourage them in their learning by asking questions about what they are learning in class, and model Christ in your daily life.

#### What is the church's role in confirmation?

First Lutheran Church is strongly committed to Christian education. The teachers who work with your child each week plan and prepare their lessons carefully. They will care for you and your child and give you the tools you need to nurture their faith formation.

#### Class Expectations

Students are expected to attend class regularly and complete any assigned homework, be present with their family in worship, complete the required amount of worship notes and service points, and attend one retreat experience during the school year. During Lent, attendance at Wednesday worship services is expected, along with 4 worship notes, in addition to the total for the year. 6<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> grade meets in the fellowship hall, 8<sup>th</sup> grade in room 203, and 9<sup>th</sup> grade in the Fireside room.

# Adult Fellowship

Parents who are interested in socializing and getting to know other confirmation parents, or are looking for a place to read or work, are invited to use the first floor lounge.

#### Worship Notes & Service Points

Students in 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade will continue to choose their service experiences based on their interest areas. Students in 6<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> grade will explore many aspects of serving as they meet members of First Lutheran and learn about the many opportunities for service within the church community, as well as in the community outside the church. All students will complete 12 service points and 12 worship notes over the course of the year.

Service areas include: deacon, usher, altar guild, reader, AV team, special music, assist in Sunday School or nursery, member of a choir, Cardboard City, Family Service Days, art work for bulletin, meal for Hope House, make communion bread, clean-up quiet bags, and much more! Each hour of service equals ½ point.

For other ideas, please talk to your teacher and get approval before doing the project. A service sheet (on bulletin board in Fireside) will need to be filled out and signed by the person supervising each project. Sheets can then be turned in to the same place as worship notes.

#### Retreat Experiences

Retreat experiences are an important part of faith formation and developing friendships within the group. Students have the following options for their retreat experience this year (options listed in order of church's preference):

**6**<sup>th</sup>-**8**<sup>th</sup> **grade**: 1) Junior High Blast at Imago Dei Village, November 2-4 **OR** 

2) Junior Youth Gathering (Synod event), February 16-17 (location TBA)

**9<sup>th</sup> grade:** 1) Senior Youth Gathering (Synod Event), November 9-11, **OR** 2) Church retreat at Imago Dei Village, January 18-20

The cost to each family for these retreats will be approximately \$50-\$75 while confirmation fees and church budget pays the remainder. If your family is in financial need, please check with Stephanie or Pastor Harswick for available campership money.
