Who can attend? 3K-Grade 6

3K: 3 years old by September 1st (or by permission of SS Coordinator) Friends are always welcome to attend Sunday school. If they would like to come on a regular basis, please request a registration form.

What time is Sunday School?

10:10-11:10 a.m. You may bring your child as early as 10:00 am.

Where do the students meet? *Please do not leave your child unattended until the leaders arrive Grades 3K-6 - Chapel

When do I pick up my child?

Sunday school is dismissed at 11:10 am.

3K, 4K, and 5K need to be picked up from their classroom: Room 211.

While waiting for your child, please do not disturb the classes that are in session.

What if we miss a week?

What about an offering?

Weekly offerings are received in all of the grades, 3K-grade 6. Offering envelopes are optional. The offering money will be used to support ELCA Good Gifts projects around the world, and local missions to be determined with help from the students.

What is expected of the students?

- 1. Give a verbal warning.
- 2. Speak to parent.
- 3. Have a pastoral, parent, teacher and student conference.
